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CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR WP BOWLS COMPETITIONS A - GENERAL CONDITIONS

A1 Laws of the Sport of Bowls

The Laws of the Sport of Bowls, Second Edition & Domestic Regulations adopted by Bowls SA shall apply to all games, matches, competitions and championships.

A2 Controlling Body

The controlling body for all District competitions and championships shall be the Executive, who may delegate the function of controlling body to one or more specified members of the Executive, who in turn shall be represented at club level by the duty umpire and/or club competition official.

A3 Registration of Players

- 3.1 Any player intending to participate in any District competition or championship shall have been registered with the District in the prescribed manner for the current season as a bona fide member of the club which such player intends to represent.
- 3.2 In the case of any competition or championship requiring the name or names of players to be submitted together with the entry for that competition or championship, the player shall have been registered no later than the closing date for entries.
- 3.3 In the case of competitions and championships where the composition of teams is dependent on selection or declaration before or during such competition or championship, a player shall have been registered no later than 48 hours prior to the commencement of the round in which such player first participates.
- 3.4 Players who have not been registered in accordance with the above shall be deemed to be ineligible players.
- 3.5 The onus is on clubs and players to ensure that players have been registered, particularly in the case of new members.

A4 Eligibility

- 4.1 Except in the case of those competitions or championships where the eligibility of participants is otherwise specified, any player who has played for a particular club in any District competition or championship shall be deemed to be an ineligible player if he or she has played or plays during the same season and in the same competition or championship for:
 - 4.1.1 another club;
 - 4.1.2 another team in the same club if the competition or championship is between teams; or
 - 4.1.3 another side in the same club if the competition or championship is between sides,

- 4.2 In any competition or championship which limits the number of players per team or side, players who participate in excess of the prescribed number shall be deemed to be ineligible players.
- 4.3 Except in the case of those competitions or championships where an alternative penalty is specified, any team which includes an ineligible player shall forfeit the match or matches played in which the ineligible player participated.
 - 4.3.1 In competitions or championships played on the knock-out basis, the team which last lost against the team being penalised shall proceed to the next round, unless, at the sole discretion of the Executive, it is possible to replay earlier rounds involving the non-eligible player without disrupting the scheduled program.
 - 4.3.2 In competitions or championships played on a league or round robin basis, points for a forfeited match shall be awarded to the non-offending team and the actual shots scored shall be recorded if the non-offending team won the forfeited match. No shots shall be recorded if the non-offending team drew or lost the forfeited match.

A5 Entry Forms and Fees

- 5.1 The entry forms supplied by the District shall be used in all instances, but may be accompanied by a separate list of entries in the same format as the original entry form showing the required information set out below.
- 5.2 Entry forms shall in all instances
 - 5.2.1 state each entrant's BSA number, surname and full initials;
 - 5.2.2 be completed with the names of skips arranged in alphabetical order;
 - 5.2.3 be accompanied by the correct entry fees;
 - 5.2.4 be submitted to the District's office by the stated closing time and date.
- 5.3 Entry fees are not refundable in the event of the cancellation of an entry on or after the closing date for any competition or championship.

A6 Withdrawals and Scratching

- 6.1 Players or teams withdrawing from a District competition after the draw has been published will be required to furnish valid reasons for withdrawing in writing, failing which disciplinary action may be taken in terms of Clause 11.2.3 of the Constitution.
- 6.2 A player or team wishing to withdraw or scratch from any competition or championship within seven days prior to commencement of play in the first round of any competition or championship, shall:
 - 6.2.1 inform the opposing skip or the Secretary of the club of which the opposing skip is a member;

- 6.2.2 inform the Secretary of the club at which the match is to be played;
 - 6.2.3 confirm to the District Secretary that 6.2.1 & 2 have been properly dealt with; and
 - 6.2.4 thereafter inform their own club Secretary that 6.2.1, 2 & 3 have been complied with.
- 6.3 Any player who participates in any District competition or championship where play is on a knock-out basis, and who, after having been successful in one or more rounds, then withdraws for reasons which, in the sole opinion of the Executive, are deemed to be unacceptable, is guilty of unsportsmanlike behaviour, and shall be disqualified from participating in any WP Bowls competition or championship for up to a maximum of two full seasons.

A7 Format of Play and Determination of Winners

- 7.1 The following conditions shall apply to all competitions or championships unless the modus operandum for a competition or championship specifies otherwise.
- 7.2 Number of Ends or Shots
 Fours Matches: 21 ends. Triples Matches: 18 ends.
 Pairs Matches: 21 ends. Singles Matches: 21 shots.
- 7.3 Number of Bowls
 Fours Matches: 2 bowls per player.
 Triples Matches: 3 bowls per player.
 Pairs Matches: 4 bowls per player.
 Singles Matches: 4 bowls per player.
- 7.4 The entries for any competition or championship are either drawn or allocated into as many sections as are required in terms of the number of entries or in terms of the modus operandum for a particular competition or championship.
- 7.5 Competitions and championships are played in sections either on a knock-out basis throughout or initially on a league (round robin) basis, followed by a play-off between section winners on a knock-out basis.
- 7.6 Where the initial sectional play is on a league basis, each team or side in a section will usually play each other team or side in the same section. It occasionally happens that more teams or sides are drawn or allocated into a section than are required for a normal round robin, and in such cases a team or side will not play all the other teams or sides in a section. Conversely, because of an odd number of entries or because of withdrawals, teams may have one or more byes in league play.
- 7.7 In sectional play on a league basis, a team winning its match shall score two points, and the losing team scores no points. If the match is drawn (peeled) each team scores one point.

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The winner of the match is determined as follows:

- 7.11.1 The side scoring the higher number of points is the winner.
 - 7.11.2 If both sides have the same number of points, the winner shall be the side with the higher net score. (Total Shots For minus Total Shots Against).
 - 7.11.3 In the event of a tie on points and net score, the side with the lower total shots against will be declared the winner.
 - 7.11.4 If a tie still prevails (i.e. equal points and equal shots for and against), an extra end shall be played by all the teams with the side captains tossing a coin to determine the right to lay the mat and throw the jack.
 - 7.11.5 In a match between sides each of three teams, the side with two or three teams winning the extra end, irrespective of the number of shots for and against, will be declared the winner of the match. Burnt extra ends must be replayed by the two teams involved, as must any extra end resulting in a no-shot.
 - 7.11.6 In a match between sides each of two teams, the side winning both extra ends, irrespective of the number of shots for and against, will be declared the winner of the match. If each team wins an extra end, the side winning an extra end by the greater margin of shots shall be declared the winner. If each team wins the extra end by the same number of shots, an additional extra end or ends must be played until a result is achieved. Burnt extra ends must be replayed by the two teams involved.
- 7.12 The draw for the winners of sections played on a knockout basis is predetermined. It is only after the conclusion of the last round of sectional play on a league basis and the determination of the section winners that the draw for the play-off on a knock-out basis can be done.
- 7.13 The Executive shall have the sole discretion to amend the above conditions when deemed necessary, and may do so at any time before or during the progress of a competition or championship.

A8 Starting Times and Grace Period

Competitors shall be allowed 15 minutes grace after the stipulated time for the commencement or continuation of a competition or championship and unless an explanation satisfactory to the umpire or other presiding official is given, the offending players shall be deemed to have scratched and the points or match awarded to their opponents. No shots shall be recorded if the match is one played on a league or round-robin basis.

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- 7.8 In sectional play on a league basis involving sides of more than one team, the side which scores a higher aggregate of shots for (total of all teams) than aggregate of shots against also scores one bonus or 'aggregate' point. If the aggregate shots for and against are equal, the aggregate point is shared. The aggregate point is in addition to the team points for winning or drawing.
- 7.9 At the conclusion of sectional play on a league basis, the winner or winners of the section, who will proceed to the knock-out sectional play-offs, may be specified as being the team(s) or side(s) which achieve the highest or highest equal total points. In other competitions or championships, it may be specified that only one team or side shall qualify for the section winners' play-offs. The method for determining a single winner of a section in such a case, as well as for ranking the remaining teams or sides in positional order, is as follows:
 - 7.9.1 The winner of a section played on the league basis shall be the team or side achieving the highest total points.
 - 7.9.2 If two or more teams or sides have the same number of points, the winner shall be the team or side with the higher net score. (Total Shots For minus Total Shots Against).
 - 7.9.3 In the event of a tie on points and net score, the side with the lower total shots against will be declared the winner.
 - 7.9.4 If a tie still prevails, (i.e. equal points and equal shots for and against), the winner shall be the team or side which won the match played between the two tied teams or sides.
 - 7.9.5 If a tie then still prevails, the winner shall be determined by the toss of a coin in the case of a tie between sides, or, if two teams are still tied, by the team winning the last decisive end in the league match played by the teams involved. If two teams are still tied and did not play each other, the winner shall be determined by the toss of a coin.
 - 7.9.6 The relative position of other sides in a section shall be determined on the same basis as for the winner.
- 7.10 Except for singles competitions or championships which are played to a specified number of shots, competitions or championships matches between teams which are on the knock-out basis are played to the specified number of ends, with an extra end or ends being played to determine a winner. The skips shall toss a coin to determine who has the right to lay the mat and deliver the jack and first bowl for each and every extra end.
- 7.11 In the case of matches between sides played on the knockout basis, each team winning its match shall score two points, and the losing team scores no points. If a match is drawn (peeled) each team scores one point. The side with a higher aggregate of shots for than shots against also scores one aggregate point. If the aggregate shots for and against are equal, the aggregate point is shared.

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A9 Tea Breaks

- 9.1 In all District competitions and championships, except singles matches or where otherwise directed by the Executive, a tea break may be taken approximately half-way through the course of a match. Skips may agree not to take a tea break and instead play right through, but common courtesy requires that this decision be conveyed to the club catering staff before play commences.
- 9.2 Singles players will not be required to commence another match within twenty minutes after the conclusion of a match, during which time refreshments or tea may be taken.
- 9.3 No tea break is permitted during any round of any WP Bowls competition or championship played on a Sunday afternoon.
- 9.4 All players in WP Bowls competitions and championships played other than on a Sunday afternoon are obliged to pay the host club the prescribed fee for tea, normally prior to commencement of any match, and irrespective of whether the players have tea or not. Clubs may not charge any green fee over and above the prescribed fee for tea.
- 9.5 If inclement weather threatens to disrupt play, a decision may be taken by the controlling body or other responsible official to delay a tea break until after the conclusion of the 15th end. This decision may be taken at any time before or during a match.

A10 Reserves and Substitutes

- 10.1 The following conditions apply to all competitions and championships except those where the use of reserves and/or substitutes is specifically not permitted.
- 10.2 Although there are generally restrictions on the use of reserves (e.g. he or she shall not have played for another team in the same competition), there are no restrictions on the eligibility of bona fide substitutes. A substitute for a single match or part thereof may be any registered player of the appropriate gender, irrespective of whether he or she has previously played in the same competition. If possible, when substitutes are required, the club competition official or duty umpire should call for names of between two to six volunteers and the skip of the team requiring a substitute should then be invited to draw a name from those available.
- 10.3 Fours Matches
 - 10.3.1 When one player fails to appear within 15 minutes of the scheduled time for the start of a fours match, or is forced to withdraw during the course of a fours match, a registered reserve, or, if no reserve is available, one approved substitute shall be allowed to complete the team.
 - 10.3.2 If such player is brought in at the start of the match, he or she may play in any position.

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- 10.3.3 If the match has commenced the skip of the team or, if the skip is absent, the third, who shall then skip, shall arrange the positions of the reserve or substitute and of the other two players.
- 10.3.4 The team concerned may decide, if it so chooses, to play with only three players, in which case the team may be re-arranged and the players playing as lead and second while one player is absent shall each play an additional bowl at each end during the absence of the fourth player, but the team shall forfeit twenty-five percent of the shots scored during the absence of the fourth player. Fractions of a shot shall be recorded.
- 10.3.5 If a match is suspended and resumed on another day, and any one of the players who comprised the team at the time the match was suspended is not available, then the same conditions as above shall apply, except that any reserve or substitute may not skip.
- 10.3.6 A player arriving after the start of a match and before the completion of the fifth end shall be permitted to join in the match at the start of the next end provided no reserve or substitute has already taken his or her place.
- 10.4 Triples Matches
- 10.4.1 When one player fails to appear within 15 minutes of the scheduled time for the start of a triples match, or is forced to withdraw during the course of a triples match, a registered reserve, or, if no reserve is available, one approved substitute shall be allowed to complete the team.
- 10.4.2 If such player is brought in at the start of the match, he or she may play in any position.
- 10.4.3 If the match has commenced the skip of the team or, if the skip is absent, the second, who shall then skip, shall arrange the positions of the reserve or substitute and of the other player.
- 10.4.4 If a match is suspended and resumed on another day, and any one of the players who comprised the team at the time the match was suspended is not available, then the same conditions as above shall apply, except that any reserve or substitute may not skip.
- 10.4.5 If no reserve or substitute is available, the team shall forfeit the match.
- 10.5 Pairs Matches
- 10.5.1 When one player fails to appear within 15 minutes of the scheduled time for the start of a pairs match, or is forced to

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A12 Umpires and Club Officials

- 12.1 Staging clubs shall be responsible for appointing a duty umpire and/or a club competition official, except when umpires are appointed by the District for the final rounds of competitions and championships.
- 12.2 Umpires and/or the club competition official appointed by clubs shall be deemed to have been appointed by the District and shall at all times act as the delegated controlling body and shall have all the powers conferred on them as required by these Conditions of Play.

A13 Clothing, Colours and Footwear

- 13.1 All players in a team or side wearing coloured clothing save for head- or footwear and protective clothing in the case of inclement weather, shall be similarly dressed. Headwear, if worn, may have approved insignia or hatbands. Caps are to be worn with the peak facing forward. The use of umbrellas during play is not permitted without a medical certificate.
- 13.2 Shirts and blouses shall have conventional collars and be adequately buttoned.
- 13.3 Men players may wear full length trousers or tailored shorts (knee length) which must have a front zip and pockets. (Under no circumstances shall Cargo, Combat, Draw String, Denim trousers or Rugby shorts be permitted). Ankle socks, predominately white, must be worn with shorts.
- 13.4 Women players may wear dresses, skirts, walking shorts and either three-quarter or full length non see through tailored pants.
- 13.5 For any District competition that is not club selected, both men & women may wear sponsored or coloured shirts, but shall be similarly dressed, except in the case of Midweek and Mixed Fives (see Midweek and Mixed Fives conditions of play).
- 13.6 In the case of clubs which have registered adhesive coloured bowls discs, all players in a team shall use bowls with the discs attached, failing which all players in the team must remove the adhesive discs.
- 13.7 In the case of sides consisting of more than one team, it will be acceptable for one or more teams to use bowls with discs and for the other team or teams in the same side to use unmarked bowls.
- 13.8 In all District competitions and championships, approved adhesive club discs or coloured discs supplied by the District shall be deemed to be part of the bowl.
- 13.9 Players, Umpires and Markers shall wear conventional shoes or sports shoes which have a continuous smooth sole or a sole with a channel rise in the middle of the sole, as long as the sole is clearly in one piece and the heel area does not sit at a different height to the front of the shoe. To assist in traction the sole can have indented grooves up to 2 mm (thickness of matchstick), but no protuberances. The width of the rear part of the shoe shall be at least 50% of the widest part of the

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- withdraw during the course of a pairs match, a registered reserve, or, if no reserve is available, one approved substitute shall be allowed to complete the team.
- 10.5.2 If such player is brought in at the start of the match, he or she may play in any position.
- 10.5.3 If the match has commenced, the reserve or substitute may not skip the team.
- 10.5.4 If a match is suspended and resumed on another day, and any one of the players who comprised the team at the time the match was suspended is not available, then the same conditions as above shall apply, except that any reserve or substitute may not skip.
- 10.5.5 If no reserve or substitute is available, the team shall forfeit the match.

A11 Venues

- 11.1 All District competitions and championships shall be played on greens and on dates and at times decided by the Executive.
- 11.2 Clubs will be required to make their greens available for play in any of the rounds of any District competition or championship for which members of such clubs have entered.
- 11.3 Clubs whose members have entered any District competition or championship are not permitted to arrange club fundraising and similar events on the days of play of such competition or championship (in particular, the days on which opening rounds are scheduled to be played) unless written application has been made to and permission granted by the District before the closing date for entries for that competition or championship.
- 11.4 It is expected of all clubs that they shall maintain their greens in good condition, and if such greens are selected as venues for any District competition or championship, to ensure that the better green or greens are adequately prepared for play.
- 11.5 Clubs are required to notify the District immediately it becomes apparent that the greens of the club are not suitable for use as a venue in any District competition or championship.
- 11.6 Clubs which are selected as venues for any District competition or championship and which fail to notify the District of below standard greens, who fail to prepare greens for play or who request not to be used as a venue after the draw has been published, shall, at the sole discretion of the Executive, be liable to a fine not exceeding R200 or such other penalties as the Executive may decide.
- 11.7 The Executive shall have the discretion to determine the venue of any incomplete match which must be resumed on another day.

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sole. Conventional sandals are acceptable providing they have a back strap. The District reserves the right to allow or disallow the use of specific colours and brands of footwear.

A14 Marking of Singles Matches

- 14.1 It is the responsibility of clubs staging singles competition or championship matches to appoint suitable markers, except where markers are appointed by the Executive for the final rounds of singles competitions or championships. Markers are requested to refrain from smoking and using cellular phones whilst doing duty.
- 14.2 To assist staging clubs, it is a condition of entry into any singles competition or championship that losers in the first and second round on any one day shall make themselves available for marking the immediate next succeeding round on the same day.
- 14.3 Losing players are to be appointed as markers in the same order as they completed their matches.
- 14.4 No losing player shall leave the venue without the prior knowledge and consent of the duty umpire or club official.
- 14.5 Losing players who refuse to mark or who leave the venue without the consent of the duty umpire or club official will be subject to disciplinary action.

A15 Score Cards and Charts

- 15.1 Staging clubs shall be responsible for supplying and preparing score cards for all WP Bowls competition and championship matches played, except when prepared score cards are provided by the District.
- 15.2 Score cards, which must be kept by the skip, must be completed correctly, clearly and legibly with the following information:
- 15.2.1 Surnames and initials of all players;
- 15.2.2 Club names of teams;
- 15.2.3 Competition name, venue, round number, date, green and rink number;
- 15.2.4 End-by-end scores;
- 15.2.5 Skips' names above each column of end-by-end scores.
- 15.3 Unless stipulated on draw charts, skips must draw for rinks.
- 15.4 In all matches other than singles matches, the Skip of the team which won the toss for opening play shall update the score-board and the opposing Skip shall keep the score-card. (See Law 37.1.8.)
- 15.5 In singles matches, the marker shall keep the card and mark the score board, which shall be checked by the marker and the duty umpire before calling on the players to acknowledge its accuracy by signing the score-card.
- 15.6 At the conclusion of a match, the duty umpire shall check the score card to the score board in the presence of both skips (and marker, in the case of singles), and all shall sign the score card as a true and

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**WP BOWLS COMPETITIONS
B - LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP (MEN)**

Flag Premier Division

- 1 The Premier Division shall consist of ten teams with no Club being represented by more than one team.
- 2 Sides shall consist of three teams of four players each, all players being members of the same Club. A captain shall be appointed for each side.
- 3 Each side shall play every other side on a league basis of nine single rounds.
- 4 The scoring of matches shall be determined in accordance with Clauses A7.7 and A7.8.
- 5 The second-last and last sides shall be relegated to the First Division.
- 6 The following penalties shall apply in the event of default:
 - 6.1 If a team in a side fails to play or complete a match, the opposing team shall be awarded two points (no shots for or against to be recorded).
 - 6.2 If more than one team in a side fails to play or complete a match, the side shall be adjudged to have scratched and the opponents shall be awarded seven points (no shots for or against to be recorded).
 - 6.3 If a side withdraws from the Competition, all scores and points for or against such side shall be expunged from the records.
- 7 Only three Premier Division players may be dropped to a lower division each week and no player from the Premier Division shall be permitted to play in a lower division during the second last and last rounds of league play, or any knock-out round, unless the player has played at least one game in that division.
- 8 Players interchanged contrary to the above shall be deemed to be ineligible.
- 9 Reserves and Substitutes – No substitutes are permitted. Only reserves as stated on the Declaration Form on the day of play may play. A team playing with only three players shall have 25% of their shots deducted.
- 10 A side which includes an ineligible player in any of its teams during league play shall forfeit the match and have five points deducted from its accumulated points scored in all matches in which the ineligible player played. The opposing side shall be credited with points earned and actual shots scored in the match.
- 11 To ensure a proper control of results Clubs shall use the stationery supplied by the District for the purpose of recording names of players comprising their sides and the results of completed matches. Clubs may, however, use their own declaration forms provided that the format is the same as the prescribed form. Scorecards and Match Declaration Forms shall be retained by Clubs until one month after the completion of the Competition each year. Results shall be dispatched to the District in time to arrive within forty-eight hours of the match being played. Incomplete results shall be dealt with as set out in Clause A16.

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- 8 The winning sides of each section of a Division will play one another to determine the Division winner.
- 9 Interchange of players.
 - 9.1 A Club that has more than one side in the same Division may interchange players between sides before the commencement of any match.
 - 9.2 In sides of twelve players only three players and in sides of eight players only two players may be dropped to a lower division each week and no interchange of players will be permitted to a lower division in the second last and last rounds of league play and knock-out rounds unless the player has played at least one match in that Division.
 - 9.3 Players interchanged contrary to the above shall be deemed to be ineligible.
- 10 The scoring of matches shall be determined in accordance with Clauses A7.7 and A7.8.
- 11 Reserves and Substitutes – No substitutes are permitted. Only reserves as stated on the Declaration Form on the day of play may play. A team playing with only three players shall have 25% of their shots deducted.
- 12 A side which includes an ineligible player in any of its teams during league play shall forfeit the match and have five points (three points in the case of last Division) deducted from its accumulated total points scored in all matches played under league play conditions. The opposing side shall be credited with points earned and actual shots scored in the match. Sides introducing an ineligible player in any knock-out match shall forfeit the match to the non-offending side.
- 13 The following penalties shall apply in the event of default:
 - 13.1 If a team in a side fails to play or complete a match, the opposing team shall be awarded two points (no shots for or against to be recorded).
 - 13.2 If more than one team in a side fails to play or complete a match, the side shall be adjudged to have scratched and the opponents shall be awarded seven points, with the exception of the last Division where five points will be awarded (no shots for or against to be recorded).
 - 13.3 If a side withdraws from the Competition, all scores and points for or against such side shall be expunged from the records.
- 14 To ensure a proper control of results Clubs shall use the stationery supplied by the District for the purpose of recording names of players comprising their sides and the results of completed matches. Clubs may use their own declaration forms provided that the format is the same as the prescribed form. Scorecards and Match Declaration Forms shall be retained by Clubs until one month after the completion of the Competition each year. Results shall be dispatched to the District in time to arrive within forty-eight hours of the match being played. Incomplete results shall be dealt with as set out in Clause A16.
- 15 In the event of inclement weather during league play, Clause A17.8 shall apply.

- 13 Badges will be awarded to members of the winning team who have played six or more matches.
- 14 Trophies

Flag Lower Divisions

- 1 Each Club may enter two sides per green. Clubs who wish to enter more sides may do so on the understanding that the additional side or sides, if accepted, may be required to play most of their matches away from home.
- 2 Sides shall consist of three teams of four players each, with the exception of the last Division where a side shall consist of two teams of four players each, all players being members of the same Club. A captain shall be appointed for each side.
- 3 All Divisions, with the exception of the last Division, shall be divided into two Sections of ten sides each. The last Division shall, depending on the number of sides, be divided into not more than two Sections.
- 4 The number of rounds in a league or knockout basis in the last Division shall not be less than seven or more than nine. The format of play for the last Division shall be either a single or double round, depending on the number of sides.
- 5 There shall be a maximum of two sides representing a Club in each division. If there are two sides from a Club in any Division they shall be drawn in different sections.
- 6 Sides in a Division shall be placed in Sections at the sole discretion of the Executive so that the sides are evenly distributed between the Sections on the basis of the relative performance of the sides in the previous season, and subject to the provisions of Clause 5 above.
- 7 The winning side of each Section of the First Division shall be promoted to the Premier Division.
 - 7.1 Should the First Division Section winners already have a team in the Premier Division; the next side in the Section that does not have a team in the Premier Division will be promoted, provided that the side is in one of the four top league positions.
 - 7.2 The Sides finishing last and second last in each Section shall be relegated to the next lower Division.
 - 7.3 The winners and runners-up of each section of the lower Divisions shall be promoted to the next higher Division. Should the Section winners already have two sides in the next higher Division; the next side in the Section that does not have a team in the higher Division will be promoted, provided that the side is in one of the four top league positions.

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- 16 Should a club enter the competition for the first time, or in the case of an amalgamation of two or more clubs, the Executive shall have the sole discretion to decide in which divisions they are placed.
- 17 The winners of each Division shall receive and hold floating trophies. The winners and runners-up in each Division shall receive a Certificate.

C - LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS (WOMEN)

Muter Premier Division

- 1 The Premier Division shall consist of eight teams with no Club being represented by more than one team.
- 2 Sides shall consist of two teams of four players each, all players being members of the same Club. A captain shall be appointed for each side.
- 3 Each side shall play every other side on a league basis of seven single rounds.
- 4 The scoring of matches shall be determined in accordance with Clauses A7.7 and A7.8.
- 5 The second-last and last sides shall be relegated to the First Division.
- 6 The following penalties shall apply in the event of default:
 - 6.1 If a team in a side fails to play or complete a match, the opposing team shall be awarded two points (no shots for or against to be recorded).
 - 6.2 If more than one team in a side fails to play or complete a match, the side shall be adjudged to have scratched and the opponents shall be awarded five points (no shots for or against to be recorded).
 - 6.3 If a side withdraws from the Competition, all scores and points for or against such side shall be expunged from the records.
- 7 No player from the Premier Division shall be permitted to play in a lower Division during the second last and last rounds of league play, or any knock-out round, unless she has played at least one game in that Division.
- 8 Players interchanged contrary to the above shall be deemed to be ineligible.
- 9 Reserves and Substitutes – No substitutes are permitted. Only reserves as stated on the Declaration Form on the day of play may play. A team playing with only three players shall have 25% of their shots deducted.
- 10 A side which includes an ineligible player in any of its teams during league play shall forfeit the match and have five points deducted from its accumulated points scored in all matches in which the ineligible player played. The opposing side shall be credited with points earned and actual shots scored in the match.

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- 11 To ensure a proper control of results Clubs shall use the stationery supplied by the District for the purpose of recording names of players comprising their sides and the results of completed matches. Clubs may, however, use their own declaration forms provided that the format is the same as the prescribed form. Scorecards and Match Declaration Forms shall be retained by Clubs until one month after the completion of the Competition each year. Results shall be despatched to the District in time to arrive within forty-eight hours of the match being played. Incomplete results shall be dealt with as set out in Clause A16.
- 12 In the event of inclement weather during league play, Clause A17.8 shall apply.
- 13 Badges will be awarded to members of the winning team who have played five or more matches.

Muter Lower Divisions

- 1 Each Club may enter two sides per green. Clubs who wish to enter more sides may do so on the understanding that the additional side or sides, if accepted, may be required to play most of their matches away from home.
- 2 Sides shall consist of two teams of four players each, with the exception of the last Division where a side shall consist of one team of four players, all players being members of the same Club. A captain shall be appointed for each side.
- 3 All Divisions, with the exception of the last Division, shall be divided into two Sections of eight sides each. The last Division shall, dependent on the number of sides, be divided into not more than two Sections.
- 4 The number rounds in a league or knockout basis in the last Division shall not be less than seven or more than nine. The format of play for the last Division shall be either a single or double round, depending on the number of sides.
- 5 There shall be a maximum of two sides representing a Club in each division. If there are two sides from a Club in any Division they shall be drawn in different sections.
- 6 Sides in a Division shall be placed in Sections at the sole discretion of the Executive so that the sides are evenly distributed between the Sections on the basis of the relative performance of the sides in the previous season, and subject to the provisions of Clause 5 above.
- 7 The winning side of each Section of the First Division shall be promoted to the Premier League.
 - 7.1 Should the First Division Section winners already have a team in the Premier League; the next side in the Section that does not have a team in the Premier Division will be promoted, provided that the side is in one of the three top league positions.

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- 7.2 The Sides finishing last and second last in each Section shall be relegated to the next lower Division.
- 7.3 The winners and runners-up of each section of the lower Divisions shall be promoted to the next higher Division. Should the Section winners already have two sides in the next higher Division; the next side in the Section that does not have a team in the higher league will be promoted, provided that the side is in one of the three top league positions.
- 8 The winning sides of each section of a Division will play one another to determine the Division winner.
- 9 Interchange of players.
 - 9.1 A Club that has more than one side in the same Division may interchange players between sides before the commencement of any match.
 - 9.2 No interchange of players will be permitted to a lower division in the second last and last rounds of league play and knock-out rounds unless such player has played at least one game in that Division.
 - 9.3 Players interchanged contrary to the above shall be deemed to be ineligible.
- 10 The scoring of matches shall be determined in accordance with Clauses A7.7 and A7.8.
- 11 Reserves and Substitutes – No substitutes are permitted. Only reserves as stated on the Declaration Form on the day of play may play. A team playing with only three players shall have 25% of their shots deducted.
- 12 A side which includes an ineligible player in any of its teams during league play shall forfeit the match and have 5 points (3 points in the case of last Division) deducted from its accumulated total points scored in all matches played under league play conditions. The opposing side shall be credited with points earned and actual shots scored in the match. Sides introducing an unregistered or ineligible player in any knock-out match shall forfeit the match to the non-offending side.
- 13 The following penalties shall apply in the event of default:
 - 13.1 If a team in a side fails to play or complete a match, the opposing team shall be awarded two points (no shots for or against to be recorded).
 - 13.2 If more than one team in a side fails to play or complete a match, the side shall be adjudged to have scratched and the opponents shall be awarded 5 points, with the exception of the last Division where 3 points will be awarded (no shots for or against to be recorded).
 - 13.3 If a side withdraws from the Competition, all scores and points for or against such side shall be expunged from the records.
- 14 To ensure a proper control of Competition results Clubs shall use only the stationery supplied for the purpose of recording the names of players comprising their sides and the results of completed matches. Clubs may, however, use their own declaration forms provided that the format is the same as the prescribed form. Scorecards and Match Declaration Forms shall

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be retained by Clubs until one month after the completion of the Competition each year. Results shall be despatched to the District office in time to arrive within forty-eight hours of the match being played. Incomplete results shall be dealt with as set out in Clause A16.

- 15 In the event of inclement weather during league play, Clause A17.8 shall apply.
- 16 Should a club enter the competition for the first time, or in the case of an amalgamation of two or more clubs, the Executive shall have the sole discretion to decide in which divisions they are placed.
- 17 The winners of each Division shall receive and hold floating trophies. The winners and runners-up in each Division shall receive a Certificate.

D - SEVENS CHAMPIONSHIPS (WOMEN)

- 1 Each Club may enter more than one side which can consist of five selected players, all being members of the same Club. A side shall consist of one trips team and one pairs team; two reserves may be registered. Registered reserves are permitted to replace any player in any round, the replaced player then becoming a reserve. A captain shall be appointed for each side.
- 2 In the event of a side withdrawing after the draw has been done and before the championship commences, the Executive shall have the discretion to accept additional entries to maintain the same number of sides as originally drawn.
- 3 The two teams in each side entered shall be drawn into sections for each of the trips and pairs separately, each section to contain a similar number of teams, such that the section and draw position in a section for each team in a club side is the same.
- 4 Should a side include an ineligible player in any of its teams during league play, it shall forfeit the match and have no points or shots scored. The opposing team shall be credited with points earned and actual shots scored in the match. Teams introducing an ineligible player in any knock-out match shall forfeit the match to the non-offending team.
- 5 Matches shall be played on a league basis.
- 6 Trips matches shall be played to 18 ends and pairs matches shall be played to 21 ends.
- 7 The scoring of all separate matches during league play shall be determined as follows:
 - 7.1 Two points shall be awarded to each winning team.

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- 7.2 Should trips and pairs teams finish with an equal number of shots, they shall each be awarded one point.
- 8 If any team withdraws from the championship during league play, all scores and points for or against such team shall be expunged from the records.
- 9 At the conclusion of the last round of league play, the winner of each of the separate sections shall be determined in accordance with Clause A7.9. Only section winners proceed to the play-offs which are played on a knock-out basis.
- 10 During the knock-out section play-offs two points shall be awarded for each match won by a team, which shall be added to the total of all points earned by that team during league play.
