7.1 By Bowls South Africa Executive [WPBA Executive in favour of 6% increase]

To increase subscription fees payable to Bowls SA by 10% (ten percent) based on the last fees paid in January 2024.

MOTIVATION

The core objective of Bowls SA is to develop and promote the sport of bowls. With ongoing cost increases, and the depreciation of the rand versus major international

currencies, it is the opinion of the Executive that to control our financial stability a modest increase of 10% (ten percent) is required.

7.2 By Associate Member – BDSA [WPBA Executive in favour]

To accept Bowls for the Disabled South Africa (BDSA), with Physically Disabled Bowlers South Africa (PDBSA) and Visually Impaired Bowlers South Africa (VIBSA) as its member organisations, as an Associate Member of Bowls SA.

MOTIVATION

Having BDSA as an Associate member of Bowls SA will allow for enhanced co-operation between Bowls SA and DBSA (including PDBSA and VIBSA). The enhanced co-operation is especially important as World Bowls moves cater for the visually impaired and physically disabled in World Bowls events i.e. World Championships and the World Cup. Bowls SA will also be able to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with BDSA to ensure proper co-ordination and collaboration between the two organisations.

7.3 By Associate Member - Nomads South Africa [WPBA Executive in favour]

To accept the Nomads Southern Africa as an Associate Member of Bowls SA.

MOTIVATION

Having the Nomads Southern Africa as an Associate Member of Bowls SA will allow for the enhanced cooperation between Bowls SA and the Nomads Southern Africa. The enhanced co-operation is especially important as Bowls SA looks at ways of assisting smaller Clubs to not only enhance their membership but to also allow members from the smaller Clubs to be able to participate in National, Provincial (Regional) and/or District events. Bowls SA will also be able to enter into a Memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the Nomads Southern Africa to ensure proper co-ordination and collaboration between the two organisations.

7.4 By Associate Member - Professional Bowls Association South Africa [WPBA Executive in favour]

To accept the Professional Bowls Association South Africa (PBA South Africa) as an Associate Member of Bowls SA.

MOTIVATION

Having PBA South Africa as an Associate Member will enhance the co-operation between Bowls SA and the PBA South Africa. The enhanced co-operation between Bowls SA and PBA South Africa is especially important as Bowls SA looks at ways to enhance the prospects of all Bowlers in South Africa. The PBA South Africa as a member of the PBA International, presenters of the World Bowls Tour, gives South African bowlers additional possibilities of gaining experiences, not only on indoor bowling greens, but internationally. Bowls SA will also be able to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with PBA South Africa to ensure proper co-ordination and collaboration between the two organisations.

7.5 By the Eastern Cape Bowls Board [WPBA Executive not in favour]

The Eastern Cape Provincial Bowls Association would like to propose an amendment to clause 23.3.1 of the Bowls South Africa Constitution to read as follows:

Provincial Bowls Associations shall receive one vote for each R250, 000 (Two hundred and fifty thousand Rand) or part thereof fees paid to Bowls South Africa. Such value to be determined on the Rand contribution paid at the 1st January 2024.

MOTIVATION

With the recent changes to the Constitution whereby Districts and hence Provinces are encouraged to register all participants on their database, as there exists a potential for the numbers of 'casual' participants to inflate the voting strength of Provinces to the extent that the control of Bowls South Africa could be vested in a couple of provinces hence creating the scenario where participants of the so called 'smaller' Provinces could to all intents and purposes be of no value when voting takes place. The adoption of this proposal will result in Bowls South Africa being governed by Council in voting strength the same as that before the change in charging for contribution to Bowls South Africa.

Eastern Cape Provincial Bowls would like to place on record that it categorically believes that all Provincial bodies act with complete integrity when exercising their current voting rights but simply place this motion before Council in order to give recognition of the role so-called 'smaller' Provinces play in the governance of Bowls South Africa affairs.

7.6 By Mpumalanga Bowls Board [WPBA Executive not in favour]

To move Inter Districts Tournament to middle March.

MOTIVATION

The Mpumalanga Executive Committee respectfully requests the BSA to reschedule the Inter Districts Tournament to mid-March due to financial year-end commitments, making it challenging for players with businesses and managerial positions to prepare adequately.

11.2. Motion from Pollsmoor Bowling Club

I hereby propose to amend the constitution in the following manner.

Voting at any Council meeting is currently covered under clause 6.3.1 and says the following:

Each Club represented at any meeting of Council by its delegate, alternate delegate or approved substitute delegate shall be entitled to one vote, plus one additional vote for each completed fifty of its registered members, with a maximum of five votes.

My proposal is to replace it with the following:

Each Club represented at any meeting of Council by its delegate, alternate delegate or approved substitute delegate shall be entitled to only one vote.

MOTIVATION

As clarification, the clause pertaining to additional votes per number of registered members must be removed. This is to avoid bigger clubs to "overpower" smaller clubs with regards to decisions taken by councils etc. Clubs in WP are shrinking, therefore voting weights could have a negative impact on smaller clubs depending on the proposals voted for.

11.3. Motion from Milnerton Bowling Club

That the **Tea Fee** (commonly referred to as Green Fee) be increased from R25 to R35.

MOTIVATION

At Milnerton BC, as with other clubs, we believe in providing greens, when Flag, Muter and other WP matches are played, that are as close to perfect as possible. Beside this, we want to ensure that all competitors enjoy their experience by providing snacks/sandwiches which are tasty and of a high quality. We are, however, experiencing difficulty in meeting these standards because of the “fee” that is being paid when WP Competitions are being played.

As everyone is aware, costs are escalating as far as equipment, fertilisers and ingredients are concerned. This increase is, we believe, not exorbitant and would encourage clubs to be in a position to provide tasty teas and sandwiches.

11.4 Motion from Durbanville Bowling Club

Dual Membership

We would like to propose that members who have dual membership at a club be required to select which club they will play at for ALL WP competitions for the upcoming season at the beginning of each season (affiliated club or dual club). It does not need to be their affiliated club - it could be their dual club, should they so choose.

MOTIVATION

This will prevent players from hopping back and forth between dual clubs as it pleases them, simplify competition administration and promote loyalty and commitment for at least one season to a club. This will also assist club selectors in their duties.

The Executive Committee as per the WPBA Constitution:

7.1 Composition

- 7.1.1 The Executive shall consist of nine members, three of whom shall be elected President, Vice-President, and Treasurer respectively.
- 7.1.2 At least two of the members shall be of the opposite gender and no Club shall have more than two members on the Executive.
- 7.1.3 All of the above shall be elected by Council at an Annual General Meeting or Adjourned Annual General Meeting.
- 7.1.4 The Executive shall be elected for a period of 2 years after which the procedure as prescribed in paragraph 7.2 of the Constitution will be effective.

There are 5 vacancies for Executive Members, with 7 nominations received. An election will be held to fill these vacancies.

Mark thanked Fairtree for their new sponsorship and appealed for other sponsors to come aboard.

The President then thanked Personal Trust for their valued sponsorship which was most appreciated, and it was a privilege to have such a sponsor.

7. To read, consider and confirm the Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting (20th August 2022)

8. To consider, and if approved, adopt the Annual Report for the year 1st July 2021 to 30th June 2023.

Proposed and seconded by Edgemoor and Malmesbury respectively. Roux Vermeulen expressed his club's appreciation to the Greens Care SC for their help during the year.

9. To consider, and if approved, adopt:

9.1. The audited WPB Financial Statements for the year 1st July 2022 – 30th June 2023

The Treasurer apologised for the late distribution of the audited AFS and explained the income statement. By containing expenses and not running some events we ended the year at a small profit. She explained the move to working from home and the consequent savings after some setup costs. Answering a question from the floor Jenny explained the Lotto money would be used for clothing, training etc.

Acceptance of the Annual Financial Statements was proposed by Meadowridge and seconded by Goodwood.

9.2. The 2023 – 2024 Budget

The Treasurer explained the structure of the budget and the need to increase our income. BSA fees and Wynberg & Littler Funds are "in and out amounts" and are recorded as such. Regarding WP fees the proposal was to increase membership fees by 6%. We need more sponsors for the District. Operational costs cover all the standing committees. Our biggest expense is the Inter-Districts – all costs have risen astronomically.

There was a query regarding staff salaries, these were increased by 5% but the figures in the income statement reflect a large increase. This will be investigated by the financial staff.

The under 30s are setting a good example on fund raising.

The under 45s raised about R 36 000 for their recent ID in Oudtshoorn.

Roux Vermeulen (Malmesbury) suggested that all fund raising, and sponsorship be funnelled through Mark Gibbs to maintain continuity. A circular will be sent to all clubs about this.

The modified Budget was approved – proposed and seconded by Meadowridge and Helderberg respectively.

10. Motions for changes

10.1. To be presented at BSA AGM:

7.1 By Bowls SA Executive (WP in favour)

To increase subscription fees payable to Bowls SA by 6% (Six percent) based on the last fee paid during January 2023.

Motivation

The last increase in subscription fees was implemented during January 2019. Subsequent to this the country experienced the Covid pandemic which placed financial burdens on Clubs, Districts and Provinces. Bowls SA was acutely aware of the financial stress caused by the pandemic and for this reason also sought to minimise financial costs to these institutions. Due to decreased activities such as capacity building and event participation Bowls SA was able to sustain itself without recourse to its members. This proposed increase is thus the first in Three years and it comes as normal activities are resumed. The proposed percentage increase is below current CPI which has always been the benchmark strived for when seeking revenue increases.

7.2 By Bowls South Africa Executive (WP not in favour)

The Executive wish to propose a change to the resolution taken by Council in 2015 that determined that the BSA Junior Nationals would be permanently held in Bloemfontein, with the SFS being the hosting District.

Motivation

The Executive would like to bring the Junior Nationals in line with the other BSA National tournaments and give the youth the opportunity to travel to other Districts each year. This will give players the opportunity to have a home tournament when the tournament is allocated to their District and also afford them the opportunity of competing and experiencing other Clubs and Greens. The current system whereby each team that enters is given an equal amount to help with costs, depending on the budget will be revised. The idea being that there will be 3 scales –

- *Closest to the Hosting District*
- *Neighbouring Districts*
- *Far away districts*

11. Presentation of Long Service Awards and certificates

There were no proposals for Long Service Awards

12. To elect Honorary Life Members

There were no proposals for Honorary Life membership.

13. To deal with any Correspondence

No correspondence was received.

14. To elect Executive Committee Members for the incoming season 2023 – 2024

The President explained to the meeting that there had been a misunderstanding regarding Ms Soekie Fourie's tenure on the committee and asked the meeting for permission to accept her late nomination which was unanimously accepted. The President gave special thanks to Ms Jenny Griffiths for her exceptional input to the Executive and wished her well in her role at BSA. He also thanks Mr Noel Solomon for his service and the way he has raised the awareness of bowls with his coverage of events on his You Tube channel. Noel responded that he would continue to do this for Bowls.

WESTERN PROVINCE BOWLS - REPORTS

President's Report For 2023-2024

It is astonishing to be presenting another report so soon. I know it has been a year since the last one, but it does feel like only a couple of months have passed. It has been an incredibly busy year.

In my last report I discussed how we had restructured our administration office to cut costs, and completely changed the Executive Structure. These changes have continued to bear fruit with WP Bowls now operating with a much more modern structure.

We had a couple of resignations from the Executive Committee during the year, and it was gratifying to see so much interest in joining the Executive from club members throughout the district. It was only a couple of years ago that we could not fill the Executive without a second round of requests.

There is far more discussion and debate among members about any decision made or action taken by the Executive than a few years ago, and I think this is a wonderful thing. The members of this district are becoming way more involved and passionate about our sport, and this can only bode well for the future.

Sponsorship

Personal Trust is our long-standing headline sponsor, and I don't know how we would manage without them and their commitment to bowls on so many different levels. I cannot thank Personal Trust enough for their support of so many of our clubs, as well as WP Bowls.

Last year I mentioned that we had completed a detailed analysis of the costs of each competition and looking for more targeted sponsorship opportunities. As mentioned in Council meeting, we have since amended this approach and a comprehensive sponsorship proposal document has almost been completed. This document seeks to more clearly define the exposure available through sponsoring bowls and offers different sponsorship opportunities across the whole of WP Bowls, as opposed to only for individual competitions.

We see this new approach as being vital to the growth of our district and hope to have the proposal document ready for distribution shortly.

WP Competitions

With the difficulties of the drought and the Covid pandemic firmly behind us, we have had another packed season of district competitions, albeit with plenty of controversy.

With a growing membership, and increasing participation in District competitions, we are constantly revising and trying to streamline our calendar. This year we required 42 competition days to complete the district competitions, with the season running from the first week in December and completing in July.

This is down from the number of days in previous years. We have reduced the number of days by playing more games per day in competitions where possible and removing the Power Trips from the calendar.

BSA has, however, done completely the opposite. Until 2024, the SA Masters, Inter District tournaments, Disabled Nationals, Men's and Women's National Championships took 11 competition days from the calendar from us.

They also held 2 Gold Squad camps, one that often conflicted with league play, and one outside our competition season. Where clubs had players selected for the Gold Squad, they had to make do without that player for the league on that weekend.

In 2024, the number of days Bowls SA used for the SA Masters, Inter District tournaments, Disabled Nationals, Men's and Women's National Championships increased from 11 to 15 as they held the Men's and Women's national tournaments separately.

They also introduced the Green Squad camps in addition to the Gold Squad camps and asked that districts not hold competitions on the same weekends. This increased the number of days needed for their competitions from 11 in previous years to 19 in 2024.

On top of this we have had an incredibly wet and cold start to Winter, with many areas having the highest rainfall in some 40 years.

I love that these challenges have reignited discussions about the format of competitions and the structure of the calendar, with more members than ever before being involved in the ongoing discussions about restructuring.

I must make a special mention of Barrie Eksteen, who has done a sterling job as Competition Secretary in tough circumstances. Over the past few years, he has streamlined the competition administration completely, with results now being available in hours instead of days. Thank you, Barrie, for all your hard work and energy. As Barrie has resigned from this role, we will shortly be announcing who the new Competition Secretary will be.

BSA Competitions

Jenny Phillips and her team ran an extremely well organised BSA Women's Nationals earlier this year, and feedback from all quarters about our organisation and administration was fantastic.

The Bowls for the Disabled Nationals were also held in our District, and we must thank Graham Ward and his team for the immense amount of work they put into this event. It was a great success.

Finance

Joy Calvert has completed her first year as the new treasurer and has certainly been burning the midnight oil! She has streamlined the accounting structure and redone the budgets so that they are presented in the same format as the financial statements.

The financial portfolio is a lot more than just preparing the financial statements though, and the first year is a huge learning curve.

Lotto and DCAS want ongoing reports on allocated funds, as well as needing new applications to be submitted. There are ongoing requests from Standing Committees and the Executive for funds for a variety of needs, with each one needing to be validated and checked against the budget.

Now that Joy is getting into the swing of things, we will be able to provide management accounts more frequently, together with budget comparisons.

Thank you for your hard work, Denise and Joy.

Membership and Marketing

This is a huge portfolio which achieves so much with so few resources, and the growing awareness of bowls in the Western Cape, and our increasing membership, show the fruits of this hard work. As her report shows, Taz Bright continues to pour her passion into our sport.

I am in favour of the new structure of the Membership and Marketing Standing Committee that Taz proposes and am looking forward to another successful season.

I would like to emphasise again that if any clubs require assistance with Membership and Marketing, they should please reach out to Taz for help.

Selectors

The Men's and Women's Selection Committees have been busy and are both running at full strength. Their presence at WP Competitions, and the number of practices and other events they have organised has certainly ramped up.

This was reflected in the performance of our teams at the Inter District championships, with our medal tally increasing again.

In 2022 we came home with 3 medals (2 Silver and 1 Bronze). This was surpassed in 2023 with the 3 medals including 2 Golds and a Bronze. This year our 6 teams came home with 5 medals! They won 2 Silvers and 3 Bronzes.

Planning for the 2025 events is already well underway, and a lot of work has already been done on setting up a new High-Performance Centre.

A Selectors job is never an easy one, with hundreds of experts judging every decision they make, and I am grateful to all of them for their dedication and commitment.

Coaches

The work being done by our coaches is invaluable and greatly appreciated. They are an integral part of the success of our players and teams. The hard work they do benefits the entire district, growing skills of top players, and developing potential amongst new bowlers.

Their involvement with the selection committees and the growth of Junior bowls is fantastic as well.

I know there are plans to run more courses during the upcoming year and encourage members to put themselves forward and get qualified.

Technical Officials

The backbone of running any competition, our Technical Officials are absolutely essential, and rarely given the recognition that they deserve. They were kept busy again over the last year, with the BSA Women's and Disability Nationals, in addition to all the WP Competitions.

Thank you to all of you for your hard work and dedication.

Greens Care

One of our hardest working committees, this has been a committed group of members working mostly behind the scenes, but with the results of their work affecting every one of us.

They have responded to a variety of requests for assistance from clubs and requests for reports on greens from the Executive and have always been absolutely thorough and professional in all respects.

In addition to this they continue to grow their website (greenscare.wpbowls.co.za) with invaluable resources, and it is becoming an amazing source of information for anyone looking after greens.

General

There has been a lot of criticism from some members about WP Bowls over the last year, but even more praise and thanks received for the time and work our volunteers put into bowls.

It is worth reminding all members that the members of the Executive and Standing Committees are all volunteers, pouring their hearts and minds in bowls for the love of the sport, and not for any remuneration.

We are all human, and will all make mistakes, but I believe that we are on the right path as a district and continue to be excited about the future.

We have streamlined our administration and management considerably, performed better at national competitions than at any time in recent years, continued to grow membership, have a growing number of juniors, and have ongoing increases in entries to district competitions.

These are all fantastic results independently and combining them shows the strength of teamwork.

Thank you to all our clubs and members for your passion for bowls and thank you for providing me with the opportunity to serve you.

It is an honour and a pleasure.

MARKETING

District Standing Committee for Membership and Marketing – Annual Report 2024

The last year has been the busiest yet, with momentum building on several fronts.

Social Media

Our social media reach suffered a setback with the hacking of our Facebook page, but our reach continues to grow. Without spending large sums of money on market research, it is impossible to say for sure, but we do appear to be slowly getting across the message that younger people also bowl!

Club Involvement

Many clubs in our district are well established with volunteers already doing what is required. Some have a larger membership base that grows organically, and some are just content with the way they are presently. Some clubs have either approached me for assistance, or I have visited them and made suggestions based on their membership numbers.

Growing a club is not a one-month project, it takes time. Personal training and mentorship to create a bowling brain takes time. There are 32 clubs and one Taz.

What has been learnt over the past few years is that spending my time driving to meet with one club after another every day does not achieve much and does not allow enough time for the completion of projects.

In this respect much of my focus over the past 6 months has been at Bergvliet, Wheatfield, Gordon's Bay and Parow.

We do not want to get to a situation where we have only 10 clubs left in the district, and need to make sure that the smaller, struggling clubs are provided with the assistance that they need.

M & M Standing Committee

When it comes to the district's marketing and membership standing committee over the years, people come and go. The district has tried various ways of running this team as the ideas and topics are so diverse. Thanks must go to Janet who undertook this portfolio over the last 8 months or so. Unfortunately, she is stepping down now, but I look forward to working with the new committee.

We have often discussed having an M & M committee in each of our bowling zones. Our clubs can then work together and create catchment areas. I am more and more convinced that this is the best route forward and will be pushing to get one volunteer from each club. I can then co-ordinate the committees in each zone instead of trying to have a single committee for the entire district, as this is just not practical and is not working.

There have been lots of changes and movement on the Executive and within the committees. Lots of people are getting involved and the WP Standing Committee monthly catch-up and collaboration is a great idea for all to work together and assist with growing the sport.

There are so many exciting projects that can be implemented with additional resources! I have been informed that some clubs are not happy that they don't see me regularly and are not sure of what I am doing on an ongoing basis. I must emphasise again that there is no way for one person to visit 32 clubs regularly and make a difference at each one. Time and energy are spent on clubs that are struggling or ask for assistance with anything.

Commitment

Besides this being my job, it is also my passion, and I continue to love introducing, coaching, and retaining membership.

For this reason, I have withdrawn from attending WP Squad trials for the next season. There are events and projects that take place on weekends and my involvement cannot be at every level.

Trying to grow membership at smaller clubs is not something where the work is done only from Monday to Friday during working hours, and I need to spend many evenings and weekends involved in events.

Membership Growth

Since the Covid pandemic a large focus has been on spreading news about bowls more widely and getting images of younger members on the greens. In this context, when I say younger, I am referring to anyone under 45!

Programs which have been introduced during this period include the Hello Summer Open Fridays, School Holiday programs, Bowls Buzz, etc.

We are seeing the fruits of this work, with our membership numbers growing steadily, and numbers almost recovered to pre-covid levels. Membership is up 38% over the last 2 years.

A few selected highlights of the year include the following.

Business League Guide

The Business League guide for clubs was finished and has been made available on our website for anyone to use. This document will be update and refined with feedback from clubs on what works. Thank you again to Rob Dinnie who provided a lot of input and information based on his experiences at Helderberg. The document can be accessed on the WP Bowls website by going to CLUB RESOURCES > BUSINESS LEAGUES.

Somerset West Junior Academy

Somerset West Bowling Club initiated a junior academy project. This started with a holiday clinic during the June/July holidays and will continue on Wednesday afternoons from 31 July. It has great potential to spill into schools in the area. The hope is that this will also grow into attracting teachers and parents over time.

Thank you to Leonie Taljaard for making Somerset West available for such an initiative and for dedicating your valuable time to the growth of junior bowls.

Gordon's Bay Novice Classic

This event was a first for the club and took a fair amount of time to organise. The idea behind this tournament was to lift the profile of the sports club in the community and to create some exposure for all local businesses as well.

Through sponsorships, a wonderful team of volunteers, and a full field of entries, we were able to include a live radio broadcast from the event. Helderberg FM was on site, and included discussions about bowls, interviews with players, etc.

The radio station is estimated to have 54,000 regular listeners, so hopefully we planted the bowling seed in the minds of a few and can reap the benefit when the warmer seasons hit again.

Eros Primary School bowls project at Wheatfield Bowling Club

This year has been a great year at Wheatfield for Eros Bowling School. This project initially started in 2019 and suffered a long break during Covid and for a period thereafter. We have persisted and the rewards have been so worthwhile in creating this huge bowling network of youth and giving back to the community.

To date, the following numbers have been registered:

Foundation Phase	33 learners
Intermediate/Top phases	59 learners
Teachers, physios, and assistants	15

Age groups have been divided into 3 weekly sessions on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Since Term One, Wheatfield members have made themselves available to make this program possible. The school provides weekly transport for the children and the teachers have also become highly invested in the sport for their students. The learners have had demonstrations and learned the game throughout the year with many individuals showing great potential and interest in the sport with future aspirations in mind. The school has been approached to add another coaching session with these skilled junior players and the goal is to include them as more active members of the club. Logistically, this integration will take some planning and time, but the discussions have certainly started.

Wheatfield Bowling Club provides the students and educators with refreshments after every coaching lesson. This club has gone above and beyond. As mentioned, the numbers have tripled since starting the program with the school. The weekly training will continue for the rest of the year, and we hope to have all the schoolteachers on the green playing bowls themselves before the end of the year as well.

Bowls for the Disabled

I have been a part of these bowlers for years, from coaching on weekends to assisting behind the scenes at the Bowls for the Disabled Nationals. At the end of last year, we had our second Directors Day fundraising event to create awareness and raise much-needed funds for the organisation. This event took place at Jagers BC. There were 14 teams with one blind bowler in each. Hopefully, we will see this happen again at the end of this year.

Wheatfield Eros Competition Day

On 25 July, Wheatfield BC hosted a bowls day to put learned skills into action with a competitive internal competition. Each junior team had a teacher and a volunteer club coach to assist with the game scenario and scoring. A financial contribution for the day from WP Bowls was a wonderful gesture acknowledging the relationship between one of our bowling clubs, Wheatfield and Eros Primary School.

This exciting day of bowls for Eros School has been made possible through the collaboration of WP Bowls, Eros teachers - with a special mention to Mrs Dyers and Mrs Meyer - and Wheatfield Bowling Club.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

District Standing Committee for Technical Officials – Annual Report 2024

We began the 'year' with the statement that the district is in dire need of more Technical Officials at all levels.

Unfortunately, we had been unable to hold any courses since 2021 because we had nobody in the district holding the required qualifications to do so as per a BSA ruling made at that time. Fortunately, 4 candidates were able to attend the first train the trainer course held by BSA in many years in September 2023.

The course provided a wonderful opportunity to interact with people from other districts and learn of the challenges they were facing in their districts and how, in a few cases, they had come up with ways to tackle these.

It highlighted for us that there is a gap in communication both between the National Technical Officials Standing Committee (NTOSC) and the local TOSCs as well as between the WPB 'administration' and the TOSC. This is an area that still needs a lot of work, and we are hopeful that recent interactions with the WP Executive will remedy this situation.

The BSA data base does not allow us to do a download of our technical officials in the district. This information (in part) has been manually captured by Bob Standen and now provides a base showing qualified Technical Officials, their qualification levels and clubs.

The T/O committee is a small committee and relies upon the assistance from local Clubs to keep us afloat when competitions such as the Women's Nationals are held in our District. Once again, we were supported by the clubs that hosted the tournament together with many volunteers from other clubs.

It has been a very busy year of competitions giving little time for facilitators and candidates to fit in getting new qualifications. We did squeeze in a markers course starting in March with a full class of 24 candidates. To date, 15 of these have qualified with the balance still to commit to their practical exams. Unfortunately trying to do a big group has its disadvantages – trying to get everyone together at the same time for exams. It became a long-drawn-out process to finalise everything taking up a lot of time for the facilitators. We have learnt from the experience and will plan accordingly.

We look forward to the new competitions calendar with the recent workshops and are hoping that the work that has gone into drawing this up will allow us to be able to schedule more courses in the next few months.

GREENS CARE

District Standing Committee for Greens Care – Annual Report 2024

Since our last report to the Executive in July 2023, the Greens Care Committee have continued to meet monthly and have produced several Newsletters.

We have also implemented changes to our website and are posting updated files.

The final list of Clubs recommended as venues for the Ladies National 2024, was completed, in conjunction with the Greens inspection team from BSA.

BSA introduced updated criteria for evaluating greens, allowing for a certain amount of discretion to the Provincial Greens Committees to determine their format, design and scoring system, provided it encompassed all the BSA requirements.

At our meeting on 16th October, we agreed to adopt our new form, and use it as the basis of our future inspections. New Evaluation guidelines were produced, and along with the updated Evaluation sheet, these were sent out to Clubs and posted on our website.

The most significant changes to the Evaluation process were the scoring of a green's banks, ditches and signage, which comprised a total of 10% of the overall score, and a move to evaluate the "bowling conditions" for players and included the consistency of draw, lines and speeds of each rink.

BSA has encouraged a much tougher stance on Clubs who do not have up to date levels, with a zero score being given if valid levels are not produced. This resulted in some Clubs losing 20% of their available score for each green that did not have levels.

Using the new criteria, all Clubs in the province were visited and an evaluation undertaken by members of the Committee for up to two greens per Club. These Evaluations were undertaken during January, February and March 2024.

Since that exercise was undertaken, BSA have decided to further revise the evaluation criteria, and a new updated Evaluation Form and Evaluation Guidelines Document are being finalized to take these into account.

The revised Evaluation Form and associated Guidelines will be used for our next round of annual Evaluations, which will be undertaken in early 2025, and Clubs will be advised shortly of these changes.

Several of our meetings have been dedicated to specific issues, which have included participating in the new level 2 Greenkeepers course and providing feedback to BSA on its contents and future direction, and a number of presentations by experts in the Greens care field.

We have started the process of identifying venues for the Men's Veterans competition in 2025. Once the venues have been confirmed, BSA will lead the process of making further inspections.

Members of the Greens Care Committee are actively helping several Clubs to improve their greens and are always on hand to offer advice and help to any Club who needs assistance.

During the year we dealt with several written complaints regarding venues hosting competitions, and in each case visited the Club concerned.

Finally, I wish to express my thanks to Bill McCarthy, Collyn de Witt, Vernon Dryden, Nic Marais and Brian Pearson for their constant enthusiasm and willingness to travel around the district to evaluate the greens and

offer advice and assistance where necessary, and I also wish to make a special thank you to Terry Hepworth for his continued support and advice as our BSA representative.

COACHES

District Standing Committee for Coaches – Annual Report 2024

While we haven't achieved all we set out to do this year we have been very active. Unfortunately, we were affected by the change of dates in the Western Province calendar and so a couple of courses were rescheduled for later in the year.

It is imperative that all our coaches are refreshed every four years to comply with SASCO requirements. We do this through an annual Coach-2-Coach Day. We held one on the 28th October 2023 at WPCC and had a reasonable turnout of coaches. Sessions were run by Eddie Phillips, Lynda Nurrish and Jenny Griffiths. We would encourage all coaches to come to these days as it is the one day in the year when we can get together as coaches and just connect. The time spent together is very interactive and a good way to encourage each other and to learn from each other.

In November 2023 the NSCC ran a Train the Trainer for Coaches and Lynda Nurrish and Eddie Phillips attended this course which will enlarge our pool of trained facilitators who can run coaching courses. To qualify the candidates, need to facilitate at a course in their district and both Eddie and Lynda had an opportunity to do that at our first course of 2024.

A Level 1 course was run at Strand Bowling Club on the 8th and 9th January 2024 with 16 people in attendance. Of the 16 who did the course, 13 received their badge and certificate and 1 was refreshed as a coach (her qualification was not active and to get it active she needed to do the Level 1 course).

The Z-Squad had a stop start year with the many WP competitions being run on a Saturday and Sunday which rendered the Saturday unavailable. There is a lot of interest in this squad, and we continue to see players improving because of attending this squad. We will persist with this work as many players are asking for it. Feedback from the players is that they enjoy the fact that they are getting both mental skills and physical skills to develop their game.

Chris and Lynda Nurrish, Eddie Phillips and Jenny Griffiths have worked with the HP (High Potential) Squad of ladies who did not make the final Inter District squad but who could be our Inter District players in the future. The aim is to develop both their mental and physical skills and to motivate them to improve their records.

The J-Squad is made of our junior bowlers in the district, ranging from our very competitive youngsters to those who are just starting their bowls journey. Jenny Griffiths has been assisted by Eddie Phillips, Wayne Schmidt and Janet Schmidt as we grow these youngsters in the sport. Working with juniors is different and although we include both physical and mental skills they need to be handled at their level and in a fun and interactive way. This development involves more than just the art of the game but helping them to grow socially and emotionally as well.

As a DSCC we would love to see at least one qualified coach in each club, if not more who can assist both new and existing bowlers.

A huge thank you to the many coaches in our district who spend many hours on the green assisting players to learn the game and to become better at it – we salute you!

Thank you to my committee of Eddie Phillips, Chris Nurrish, Hennie Venter and Lynda Nurrish who have assisted through this year.

The juniors who are coached by both Paul Cohen and Aloma Smith also join us at Pinelands – so all the juniors are getting to know each other and to have different exposure to players in their peer group.

A big thank you to Paul and Aloma for their input in the juniors in the Basin area. Aloma has had another intake of scholars from Strand High School and so her group continues to grow. Some work is also being done at somerset West club under Soekie Fourie and we look forward to these juniors joining in with the j-squad when they are ready.

A little work is being done in schools especially with the children at Eros School ably assisted by Taz Bright and Wheatfield Bowling club. Working with schools is not as simple as it sounds but as a district, we need to find ways to get into more schools and maybe establish a school league.

Junior Tournaments:

The TO standing committee provided us with an umpire between two rinks and they walked up and down with the juniors showing them how to mark a game. This was played at the Glen where we had hoped we would spend the weekend, but the wind came up and we were forced to move over the mountain to Meadowridge where we completed the fours tournament.

3. At the end of March 2024, we sent 2 x Under 15, 2 x Under 18 and 1 x Under 25 teams to Bloemfontein to play in the Junior Nationals. In the Under 15 section there was a total of 14 teams and all the teams played each other in a round robin. The winner of the Under 15's for 2024 was the Western Province A team and the B team ended 6th on the log.

In the Under 18 section our A team ended 3rd in their section and our B team ended 6th in their section. Some very hard-fought games and some narrow losses all added to the experience the juniors gained at this competition.

Our Under 25's played at a different venue to the under 18's and under 15's and ended 6th in their section. The team played well but had some tough opposition.

This tournament allows our juniors to play against the cream of juniors from around the country and is one of the highlights of the year. Due to costs, we can only take our top teams to this tournament which means the others don't get the same exposure. We need to keep finding opportunities for our juniors to play competitively and especially against other juniors. A huge thank you to all our managers who give up their time to look after our youngsters at these competitions.

This year the Under 18 Masters was held at Kraaifontein Bowling club on the 22nd and 23rd June 2024. Twelve of our youngsters battled it out in two sections and this year we had many more close games than we have had in the past, which shows us that the overall quality of play is getting better each year.

The final was played between Ryan Truter, who has won the two previous Masters, and Divan Joubert. This was a repeat of last year's final, but this year Divan managed to triumph over Ryan in an exciting game. The two bronze medallists were William Neethling and Werner Langenhoven who played off for bragging rights with William taking the honours in that game. Well done to all the players for providing such an entertaining weekend of bowls.

The Under 30 Masters was played at the Glen Bowling Club in superb conditions, over the same weekend as the Under 18's. Some excellent bowls was on display with Armand Ascaray finally taking on Daniel Vaughan with Daniel getting through to earn the gold medal. The bronze medallists were Kerrin Norman and Daniel Griebenhouw.

A huge thank to all those who have helped to keep the juniors on the green this season – your commitment and passion for the juniors is appreciated and needed. District Standing Committee for Disability Bowls – Annual Report 2024

The current members of the WP standing committee for Disability are:

Taz Bright – WP Representative, Eddie van der Heiden PDBSA - Convenor, Graham Ward and Princess Schroeder VIBSA.

There are 45 WP disabled Bowlers registered on the Bowls South Africa (BSA) database, as follows:

- 15 Visually impaired (4 in transit and one not yet classified) with 13 Directors (not all on data base)
- 17 Physically disabled with eight who still to be classified, which has been delayed by the recent weather.

We also have two qualified classifiers who are able to classify disabled bowlers in South Africa for registration on the International Bowls for the Disabled system:

Eddie van der Heiden (Technical) and Pat Gordon (Medical), both from Bergvliet BC.

All disabled bowlers who wish to play in Disabled Bowlers of South Africa tournaments need to be full members of a bowling club and be registered with BSA

Due to the hard work and commitment of the organising committee of Graham Ward, Eddie van der Heiden, Princess Schroeder, Jene McCourt, Leonie Taljaard, Shirley Oosthuizen and Louis Gunter as scorer a very successful Bowls South Africa National Bowls Championships for Disabled Bowlers was held in WP District at Helderberg and Somerset West BCs. during March 2024.

WP bowlers achieved 7 gold, 4 silver and 3 bronze medals.

Congratulations to our 6 WP Bowlers who were selected to represent South Africa in the IBD/International Bowls for the Disabled World Championships that were held in Gauteng from 18-31 May 2024.

They were:

- Eddie van der Heiden B6
- Margie Palmer B8 (First Protea colours)
- Princess Schroeder B3 (Graham Ward)
- Michelle Eschun B2 (Jene McCourt).

Western Province bowlers achieved the following international medals:

- Princess Schroeder B3, director Graham Ward, singles Gold
- Michelle Eschun B2, director Jene McCourt singles Silver
- And Eddie van der Heiden B6 Silver Pairs

Club Liaison / Bowls Discussion

Feedback Report

At the beginning of the season, it was felt that a need existed for the WP Executive to build a closer relationship and a better understanding of clubs, their challenges and successes and to use this as a platform, to share these ideas.

I was tasked to run with this initiative and over the past 6 months I have met with all but 4 of the clubs. Two of these tendered their apologies and the other two did not attend. Various members of the executive accompanied me on these visits.

Several similar issues were raised by the various clubs, and I have summarized these below.

- Competitions and the calendar
- The need for a detailed training program for Technical and Coaching Officers to be published as early as possible, covering the various zones in the district.
- Business Leagues were not set up at many clubs especially in the Southern Suburbs
- Old school mentality, turning many prospective new members away.
- Good membership growth in the North and Basin.
- Security is an issue at several of the clubs
- Time taken to publish draws
- Future structure of Council meetings

Many other points were raised but for purposes of this report I have only highlighted the above.

Whilst in many cases we are not able to resolve the various issues, the forum allowed clubs to share what worked for them, which they will hopefully take away and implement.

Some of the issues raised above, we as the executive can resolve, whilst others need to be done by the clubs themselves.

Going forward, and this still requires various discussions I would like to see the inclusion of various standing committee convenors in these meetings from time to time and a greater cross pollination of clubs between zones, rather than doing it purely on a geographical basis.

WP Players Committee – Annual Report 2024

Inter District Competition Performance

The Western Province Bowls Association delivered commendable performances at this year's Inter Districts. Competing with determination, the teams achieved the following results:

- **Ladies:** Secured Silver in both Open and B categories, and Bronze in the Veterans category.
- **Men:** Attained Bronze in the B and Veterans categories.

These achievements are significant, and the objective for the next five years is to strive for gold medals in at least two team categories. Feedback post-Inter Districts is crucial for players to understand areas of improvement and to sustain their team or squad positions. While the men's team received this feedback, the ladies' team is still awaiting theirs.

It is recommended that Western Province Inter District sides be selected earlier to allow ample time for team dynamics and competitive match preparation. The scheduling of WP Trials earlier in 2024 compared to previous seasons has been positively received by the players.

WP Competitions and Calendar

The season has been marred by frustration due to a disorganized WP Bowls Calendar, which has adversely affected many players. However, heartfelt appreciation goes to Mr. Nico Taljaard for his exceptional effort in consolidating input for next year's calendar and beyond. A forward-looking 24-month calendar is suggested to assist players and clubs with long-term planning. The proposed changes by Mr. Taljaard are welcomed and anticipated with enthusiasm.

Ladies Nationals: Reflections and Recommendations

The Ladies Nationals, hosted in the Northern Basin, was largely successful. However, to ensure a positive experience for all participants, it is imperative to address certain issues. The quality of greens at some clubs was below expectations, and the rush to conclude the Nationals a day early was unreasonable. Nationals, being the premier competition in South Africa, should not compel top players to endure over 100 ends in a single day. Future considerations should aim for a more professional approach.

Season Overview

The season has been challenging, with management direction and operational output appearing disjointed and unorganized, leading to a less than satisfactory experience for WP Players. Nevertheless, there is recognition of the shortcomings, and optimistic signs of change and progress are already evident.
